## An international consortium for a production for young audience

Micka is 14, feisty, fierce and a future folk singer - but that's a secret. Life is complicated. There's a whisper in the wind that is really hard to understand. Sometimes Micka hears it, sometimes she just feels it. But it's growing stronger. And it means that things are going to change. Micka just doesn't know how.

Chasing the Wind is an international production aimed at children (aged 10 and over) and families. The production uses several languages and theatre forms and tells the story with text, movement, song and audience participation. Chasing the Wind aims to encourage young people to contribute with their creativity and individuality. The performance explores issues of climate change under the motto 'Stormy times or a tailwind for change'. 6 actors from 6 countries will be accompanied by a choir of young girls, each led on site by composer and conductor Danielle O'Keefe.

The devising process will be led by Fraser Corfield, former Artistic Director of ATYP (Australian Theatre for Young Audience).

The world premiere will take place in Bradford in summer 2025 as part of Bradford 2025, UK City of Culture. This will be followed by further performances in Portugal, Spain and Italy.

At the beginning of 2026, there is the possibility of inviting the international production Chasing the Wind to Australia.

The project is modelled after ATYP's hugely successful collaboration, *Patrice Balbina's Chance Encounter*, which saw a team of ten international artists create a work for young audiences that was premiered at ATYP in 2016 before transferring to Vancouver, then going on to further seasons at the ASSITEJ World Congress in South Africa and the Commonwealth Games Cultural Festival on the Gold Coast.
